Secularism Defined

- 1. The idea that state institutions and religious institutions should be separate.
- 2. The idea religion is ought to be a purely private matter (and therefore shouldn't influence society in any way) because it is useless or harmful.

Secularism Is Hypocrisy

The Secularist Takeover

Theological liberalism paved the way for secularism by promoting Christianity as a private religion.

"Christianity is not being brilliantly attacked, it is being incompetently defended." – John Robbins

Incompetent Defenses

- 1. Theological liberalism
- 2. "Moral Majority"
- 3. "The Good Old Days"
- 4. Agreeing to keep the Bible out of political debates

A Competent Defense

- 1. Reduce unbelief to absurdity: Relativism is absurd
- 2. Proclaim truth of Christianity: Our Creator knows what's best for us
